FROM YOUR PASTOR

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. – Galatians 5:1

Dear Benton and Willow Creek Congregations,

If you were looking for the very pinnacle verse in the letter to the churches of Galatia, it would be this verse from Galatians 5:1.

But it turns out, as we survey the chosen people of Israel, God's people didn't want too much freedom. I'm thinking of the Israelite people who were just rescued from slavery in Egypt and now standing in the middle of a wilderness. Their new freedom meant that God must receive much more trust for food and everything else then they wanted to give. That was too unsettling for them and soon they were longing for the days of slavery when at least they had one square meal a day.

I'm also recalling how the chosen people, now living in the promised land, wanted a king. All of the neighboring nations had kings and Israel wanted a strong and wise king. The prophet Samuel kept telling them that they had God as their king, but they rejected that. It was too hard to rely on God for safety and protection with faith. This freedom to live in faith, proved to be unacceptable. They wanted a king to rule over them.

And now in our summer Galatians study, we continue to hear the Apostle Paul rail against these new Christians who are giving up their new-found freedom in Christ for the security of the old covenantal way. They were convinced that the gift of freedom hinged upon their ability to bring their sacrifice of the old covenant into the relationship with God. They effectively received the unconditional promise of God and made it conditional. They received the mercy of God and made it about them deserving mercy.

And, if we are honest, we all struggle with a God who would set aside all of His power and control to love us that freely, that unconditionally. Dear friends, as you celebrate Freedom Day, may you be filled with awe and joy by the true freedom that we have received through faith in God's only Son and pray for the nation that He has given us.


work. Each Sunday, Pastor Tom will help us connect this ancient but timeless message to our daily lives.
